On behalf of the Good Samaritan Foundation Board of Directors, I am honored to share this 2021 Impact Report with you.

Trusting relationships are at the heart of everything we do at Good Samaritan Foundation. Like many other communities this year, we lived through the continued effects of the Covid-19 pandemic and the uncertainty of what might come next. However, thanks to the overwhelming generosity of donors like you, Good Samaritan Foundation was able to grant over \$1.8 million in support towards hospital and patient needs.

By uniting the passion and commitment of our donors and friends, together we have accomplished what none of us could achieve on our own. Not only did we support the scholarship and training of current and future Good Samaritan healthcare workers, the Foundation was able to assist over 150 patients in gaining access to critical prescriptions, medical equipment, transportation, and treatment. We also partnered with organizations such as the United Way of Knox County and the Knox County Public Library to form wabashvalleyconnect.org, a transformative initiative that will better help our community members gain access to support, medical care, food, financial assistance, and other free or low-cost help.

However, perhaps our biggest achievement in 2021 was the completion of the Charles C. Hedde MD Health Education Center. Alongside our community, we were proud to celebrate this landmark achievement in June 2021 with hamburgers and hotdogs, dancing to the musical stylings of legendary local band, Bad Medicine. It remains surreal watching dozens of medical residents donning white coats filtering through the hallway of the Hedde Center on their way to didactic training.

From the bottom of my heart, thank you for making 2021 a hallmark year!

Since becoming Director of the Foundation at the end of November 2021, I've been overwhelmed with the generosity of our donors, friends, and healthcare leaders, who share their knowledge, insight, and wisdom. The Foundation also recently celebrated the arrival of Tina Meeks, our new Donor Relations Coordinator, who brings a wealth of talent and knowledge from the worlds of banking and community volunteerism.

While change will continue to be a big theme in 2022 for Good Samaritan Foundation, we remain committed to our unique call of philanthropically supporting and advancing the mission of Good Samaritan. 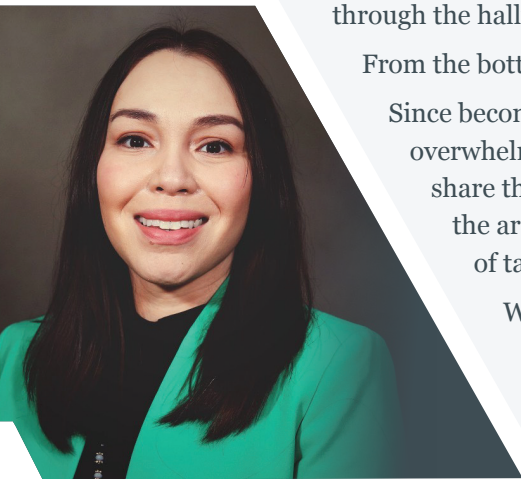
resilient communities and excited to help lead the charge that ensures every Good Samaritan patient gains access to the quality care they need.

MATT BOWMAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Matt Bowman Memorial Scholarship for Good Samaritan Employees was founded in November of 2021.

Matt was only 49 when he passed, but he made an indelible mark on those who knew him - whether it was through his involvement at The Edge Church, his service as a Lieutenant with the Vincennes Township Volunteer Fire Department, or during his time as a Registered Nurse.

During his 30 years of service at Good Samaritan, Matt continually championed the benefits of education; not only working to develop his skills, but also encouraging and mentoring others in their development as health care workers. Made according to Matt's wishes, the Matt Bowman Memorial Scholarship will be used to provide assistance for Good Samaritan Full-time or Part-time employees of any department or discipline seeking assistance for health-related certifications, review courses, conferences or educational boot camp fees.

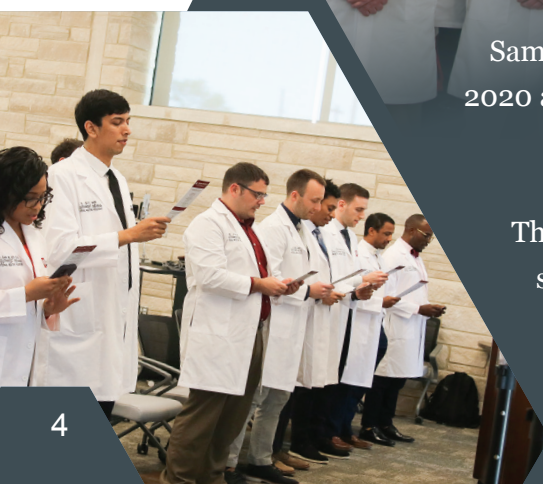


GOOD SAMARITAN FOUNDATION CHARLES C. HEDDE, MD HEALTH EDUCATION CENTER

After four years of hard work and perseverance, Good Samaritan Foundation celebrated the grand opening of the Charles C. Hedde, MD Health Education Center on June 11th, 2021. Thanks to the generosity of our donors and friends, the \$2.5 million dollar education center is now in use for staff and clinical training for both hospital employees and for the Indiana University School of Medicine Southwest Internal Medicine Residency at Good Samaritan.



Named after the late Dr. Charles C. Hedde, the education center is a continuation of Dr. Hedde's vision for increased access to top notch education and training for Good Samaritan employees and physicians. Construction of the facility began on July 3, 2020 and was completed on April 28, 2021. The Hedde Center accommodates up to 225 people and can be configured for a variety of events and activities.



The Foundation is excited to offer this state-of-the art center to Good Samaritan staff and community. This endeavor would not have been possible without the generosity of our friends, donors, hospital community, and the Hedde family.

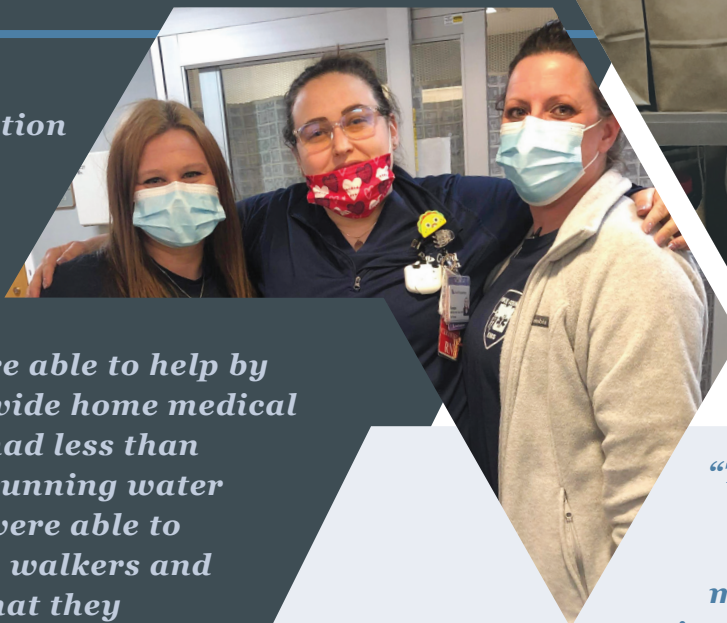

Wabash Valley Connect is a referral platform that connects people in need of assistance with the free and low cost programs that serve them.

It makes it easy for those seeking food, shelter, health care, transportation, work, financial assistance and more, to connect with the appropriate programs and services.

Wabash Valley Connect will not only serve as a tool that can assist in the alleviation of critical needs that have been compounded by Covid-19, it will also allow our local social service network to better assess existing resource gaps to more effectively distribute assistance. Good Samaritan Foundation is thrilled that United Way of Knox County, a key partner in this project, and a network of community organizations also share in this vision.

NG COMMUNITY

Good Samaritan Foundation hosted “Beach Party,” its annual concert and auction in November 2021. Beach Party is credited with raising over \$25,000 in support of Good Samaritan Foundation’s Caring Connection fund. This fund provides support for patients needing assistance with durable medical equipment, prescriptions, and other key needs.

After a major neurological event, we want to support our stroke patients and their families as much as possible. The money we raised will help provide the patient with blood pressure cuffs, or any other medical equipment they may need to be successful at home.”
